

1 Samuel 2:27 - 4:22

God Rejects Eli - 2:27-36

- † 27 A prophet tells Eli the message of God, going back to when God chose Aaron.
- † 28 The tribe of Levi was chosen to be priests with three responsibilities: offer sacrifices, burn incense and wear the ephod (serve as high priest.)
- † 29 The abuse: Eli honored his sons more than he honored God.

God Rejects Eli - 2:27-36

- † 30 Yahweh had promised that Aaron's house would serve God forever, but now he is changing that.
- † 31—The judgement: Not only Eli's house but the whole house of Aaron would be cut off.
- † 32 His family will die young.
- † 33 His descendants will die by the sword.

God Rejects Eli	-2:27-36
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- † 34 Hophni and Phineas will die on the same day.
- † 35 God will raise up a faithful priest. Who? Could point to Jesus, high priest after the order of Melchizedek.
- † 36 The disgraced house of Eli will beg to serve if only to get a morsel of bread.

God Calls Samuel - 3:1-21

- † C. 1073 BC
- † Samuel's rise and Eli's decline.
- † 1—The "boy" Samuel is serving under Eli.
- † "Word of the Lord was rare" Prophetic visions were infrequent.
- † 2 It's night, and both Eli and Samuel were lying down.

God Calls Samuel - 3:1-21

- † 3 Samuel is carrying out the duties of the high priest.
- † 4-6 The Lord called Samuel three times, and each time Samuel thought it was Eli.
- † 7 Samuel did not "know" the Lord he had not experienced God. Samuel was not yet a prophet.

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- † 8-9 The third time Eli understood that Samuel was being called by God.
- † 10 The 4th time, Samuel responds the way Eli taught him.
- † 11 God confirms the previous message to Eli.
- † 12-14 God will punish the house of Eli and no amount of sacrificing will atone for their sins.

God Calls Samuel - 3:1-21

- † 15 In the morning, Samuel seems to avoid
- † 16-17 But Eli demanded to know everything.
- † 18 So Samuel told him and Eli acquiested to God's will.
- † 19-21 From then on, Samuel was recognized as a prophet of God.

The Ark is captured - 4:1-11

- † C. 1069 BC
- † 1 Now to the Philistines. Even though the word of Samuel was heard throughout Israel, it would seem that the people did not consult him.
- † 2 The first battle Israel loses 4000.

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- † 3 Why did they lose? They assumed that God was not with them because they left the Ark in Shiloh.
- † This "God in a box" mentality is a form of idolatry, trusting the Ark instead of the one enthroned on it.

The Ark is captured - 4:1-11

- † 4 So Hophni and Phinehas brought the ark.
- † 5 When the ark arrived, the army shouted.
- † 6-8 The presence of the ark instilled fear in the Philistines because they had heard the stories of what Yahweh did to the Egyptians.
- † 9 But this motivated them.
- † 10 Israel loses 30,000 and Hophni and Phinehas are killed.

The death of Eli - 4:12-22

- † C. 1069 BC
- † 12 A Benjaminite came to Shiloh with signs of grief.
- † 13 Eli was concerned, not about his sons, but about the ark.
- † 14-15 Eli heard the uproar. He is 98 and blind.

The death of Eli - 4:12-22

- † 17 The report: Israel is defeated; Hophni and Phinehas are dead; and the ark has been captured.
- † 18 When he heard the news of the ark, Eli fell and died.
- † 19 The wife of Phinehas went into labor when she heard the news.

The death of Eli - 4:12-22

- † 20 While she was dying from the delivery, she was told she had a son.
- † 21 She named him "Ichabod", which means, "Where is the glory?"
- † 22 Her husband dead, her father-in-law dead, and the ark captured – "the glory of God has departed israel."
