


David captures Jerusalem – 5:7-8



David defeats the Philistines – 5:17-25

- † 17 – The Philistines at this time controlled much of northern Israel.
- † 18 – Valley of Rephaim is probably west of Jerusalem.
- † 19 – To “inquire of the Lord” means to make use of the Urim and Thummim.

David defeats the Philistines – 5:17-25

- † 19 – David asked God, “Should I fight?” and “Will I win?” God said “yes” to both questions.
- † 20 – “Baal-perazim” – “The Lord is breaking through.”
- † 21 – The Philistines panicked and left their idols behind.

A Second Battle – 5:22-25

- † 22 – The Philistines came against David a second time.
- † 23 – This time God gave him a strategy – go behind the enemy.
- † 24 – David would hear God’s hosts in the trees, and then attack in the rear.
- † 25 – David chased them all the way back to their land.

Ark Brought to Jerusalem – 6:1-23

- † C. 975 BC
- † 1 – From 1 Chron. 15, this event took place 30 years after Ch. 5.
- † David assembled his army to accompany the ark.
- † 2 – The ark had been kept at “Baalath-Judah” (Kiriath-jearim) for almost 100 years. (1 Sam. 7:1)

Ark Brought to Jerusalem – 6:1-23

- † 3 – The ark was supposed to be carried on poles by the Levites, but David put it on a cart.
- † 5 - The procession was a joyous celebration.
- † 6 – Uzzah sought to steady the ark.
- † 7 – He was struck dead for touching the ark.
 - † 1) The ark was on a cart, not on poles
 - † 2) The two men were not Levites
 - † 3) No one was to touch the ark (Num 4:15)

Ark Brought to Jerusalem – 6:1-23

- † 8 – David was angry, probably at himself for mishandling the ark.
- † 9 – David was afraid of the Lord because of this.
- † 10 – So David put the ark at the house of Obed-edom, a Levite.
- † 11 – The ark was there 3 months and Obed's house was blessed.

Ark Brought to Jerusalem – 6:1-23

- † 12 – So David brought the ark to Jerusalem with rejoicing.
- † 13 – This time the ark was handled properly, being carried.
- † 14 – David danced in a linen ephod, a simple robe.
- † 15 – The ark was brought to Jerusalem with much shouting and praise.

Ark Brought to Jerusalem – 6:1-23

- † 16 – Michal saw David dancing and despised him.
- † 17 – The ark was placed in a tent.
- † 18-19 – David offered sacrifices and blessed the people by distributing food.
- † 20 – Michal rebuked David for "shameless behavior."
- † 23 – Michal died without children.

God's Covenant with David – 7:1-29

† C. 975 BC

† 1. David is secure. Jerusalem is his. The palace is built. His enemies are subdued. Now what?

† 2 – David noticed the difference between his palace and God's tent.

† Nathan the prophet – we have no background for him, but he served David his whole reign.

God's Covenant with David – 7:1-29

† 3 – Nathan encourages David to proceed.

† 4 – But God's plan is different and he reveals it to Nathan.

† 5 – The word "house" is key in this chapter. David wants to build God a "house" – a temple.

† 6 – God has always "lived" in a tent – a tabernacle.

God's Covenant with David – 7:1-29

† 7 – God said that he had never asked for a building.

† 8-9 – God chose David and given him victory.

† 9b-16 – God makes four promises to David:

† 1) He would give David a great name

† 2) He would give Israel a place of safety.

† 3) He would build a "house" for David

God's Covenant with David – 7:1-29

- † **God's promises to David (continued):**
- † **3) God would build a house for David**
 - † **a)The descendant would be from David**
 - † **b)God would establish his kingdom forever.**
 - † **c) The descendant would build a house for God**
 - † **d) God would secure his kingdom forever.**

God's Covenant with David – 7:1-29

- † **God's promises to David (continued):**
- † **3) God would build a house for David**
 - † **e) The descendant would be God's Son and be disciplined like a son.**
 - † **f) God would not remove his favor from him as he did with Saul**
- 4)David's house – his dynasty – would last forever. (Matt. 1)**

David's Prayer of Thanksgiving – 7:18-29

- † **18 – "Who am I to deserve such favor?"**
- † **20 – David could not praise God adequately.**
- † **25 – David makes two requests:**
 - † **1) God would establish his house forever.**
 - † **2) A blessing on his house forever.**
